










D. Paul Schafer (Canada) Author

D. Paul Schafer has worked in the cultural field for more than fifty years as an author, advisor, educator, and administrator. He was Assistant Director of the Ontario Arts Council from 1967 to 1970, taught arts administration and cultural policy at York University and the University of Toronto, has undertaken many projects and missions for UNESCO, and is founder and director of the World Culture Project at present. He has written many books on the arts, culture, and cultures, including Canada's International Cultural Relations (1979), The Cosmological Conception of Culture: Canadian Culture Used as a Case Study for Illustrative Purposes (1992), Culture: Beacon of the Future (1998), Revolution or Renaissance: Making the Transition from an Economic Age to a Cultural Age (2008), The Age of Culture (2014), THE ARTS: Gateway to a Fulfilling Life and Cultural Age (2020), and, most recently, THE WORLD AS CULTURE: Cultivation of the Soul to the Cosmic Whole (2022).



Thomas Legrand is a wisdom's seeker, social scientist and sustainability practitioner. He is the author of "Politics of Being. Wisdom and Science for a New Development Paradigm" (2022). Holding a Ph.D. in (Ecological) Economics and having studied international development, political science, and management, Thomas Legrand works in the field of sustainability for UN agencies, private companies, and NGOs. His focus is on forest conservation, climate sustainable finance. change, and leadership, emphasizing the in particular importance of inner and cultural development for sustainability. He is currently the lead technical advisor for the UNDP-convened Conscious Food Systems Alliance.








Prof. Benno Werlen

He is a fellow of the World Academy of Art & Sciences and the Max Weber Center for Cultural and Social Studies, member of the Academia Europaea, the founder and executive director of the International Year of Global Understanding (IYGU) approved by the General Conference of UNESCO and proclaimed by the three major science councils of the Human. Social and Natural sciences, and Advisor for the Taihu World Cultural Forum. He was honored by the International Geographical Union with the Lauréat d'honneur for his 'lifelong contributions to geographical science as a distinguished, world known scholar'. He has published 16 scientific books and more than 200 papers in scientific journals and books. Most recently he is the the initiator and chair of 'The Jena Declaration on the Cultural and Regional Dimension of Global Sustainability'.






Prof. Olimpia Niglio
