

GOALS:


- 1. "Ingesting Idea Afresh"

RECONNECTING CULTURE TO YOUNGER GENERATION

ABOUT RWYC WORKSHOP

Indonesia's diverse culture is a priceless treasure. Its existence needs to be preserved for decades to come. Chakra Cultural Foundation in collaboration with "Reconnecting With Your Culture" (RWYC), an international initiative to care for culture, will carry out a virtual club activity "KulSain Klub: Treasure Hunt" which brings the younger generation closer to culture with pedagogic methods applied to cultural science. This activity is the initial initiation of RWYC in Indonesia. Previously, similar RWYC activities were held in several countries spread across 4 continents, including Italy, Spain (Europe), Morocco (Africa), Japan, India (Asia) and Venezuela, Colombia (America). AIMS

- 1. Maintaining the sustainability of local wisdom in the younger generation
- 2. Developing culture from the side of science to the younger generation
- 3. Disseminate Indonesian cultural wisdom to the global arena

In organizing this RWYC Workshop, we also collaborated with the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology, especially the Directorate General of Culture and supported by Ichinogami-Peri Kertas.







THE 1ST RWYC WORKSHOP IN INDONESIA

On November 13, 2021, in conjunction with the National Culture Week 2021, we held the first RWYC Workshop, Kulsain Klub: Treasure Hunt with the theme MY HOUSE, MY CULTURE virtually. This workshop was attended by students from elementary schools from 11 provinces in Indonesia. Each province sent three participants to take part in this cultural workshop. This activity is divided into two sessions, namely morning session and afternoon session, within two hours per session. Participation is voluntary, free of charge, and participants will receive: 1) Certificate from RWYC International, 2) Gift in the form of papercraft and RWYC pin, 3) Opportunity to be displayed at the RWYC Intercontinental Exhibition on Cultural Heritage 2022.

The activity was quite lively and the enthusiasm of the participants was very high in a cultural workshop like this. Each of them proudly introduced their local culture to their friends who were in this activity. In other words, this first Cultural Workshop was **SUCCESSFUL**. We are aware now that in fact the cultural awareness of the younger generation is very high, but the lack of space for cultural expression is a barrier for them to unleash this potential.

INTERNATIONAL RWYC CONFERENCE

HOSTING THE 1ST INTERNATIONAL RWYC CONFERENCE WIRTH THE THEME RECONNECTING WITH THE CULTURE IN THE WORLD

In the next activity, namely the first International RWYC Conference, we again collaborated with the **Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology**, especially the **Directorate General of Culture**. On November 20, 2021, we are hosting the first virtual RWYC International Conference.

The 1st International RWYC Conference consists of online activities via a zoom platform to introduce the RWYC International pedagogical method presented by the Global Director of RWYC International Prof. Olimpia Niglio, also attended by representatives of RWYC Asia, namely Prof. Rana P.B. Singh and Prof. Aditi Misra from India. Dr. Mira Sartika from RWYC Indonesia also presented the results of the RWYC cultural workshop in Indonesia. As one of the initiators, the Directorate General of Culture, Dr. Hilmar Farid was also present at this conference. Also present as a special speaker were Prof. Benno Werlen is the UNESCO Chair from the University of Jena, Germany, and D. Paul Schafer, honorary president of RWYC and initiator of The Age of Culture Project from Markham, Canada.

The RWYC Conference is a meeting of ideas, culture and people. It aims to introduce the RWYC pedagogical method by RWYC President and RWYC Networks around the world to International audiences and to open dialoguing between nations addressing culture education.

OVERVIEW OF THE CONFERENCE

AIMS

- 1.Introducing RWYC pedagogical method to Indonesia and International audiences.
- 2.To bring young generations closer to the values and content of local cultures, at the same time exposing them to the diversity of culture in the world.
- 3.To open dialoguing between nations based on culture addressing culture education to the young generation.
- 4.To share cultural knowledge from Indonesia and International participants.
- 5.To present some performance, crafted, drawing or other cultural products from children in Indonesia and International as well.

We are very happy because hopefully the above objectives can be fulfilled in its implementation. The activity was very solemn and warm. The enthusiasm of participants from all over the world was very high, including from Italy, Spain, Brazil, Colombia, Japan, India, Australia, Canada, and other countries. Each country sends a video presentation about RWYC activities in their country.

CO-SIGNATORY OF JENA DECLARATION

SUPPORTING THE JENA DECLARATION THAT BRINGS THE THEMES OF CULTURAL AND REGIONAL DIMENSIONS IN GLOBAL SUSTAINABILITY

Prof. Benno Werlen as the UNESCO Chair from the University of Jena, Germany as the initiator of the Jena Declaration, inviting our Foundation to support the Jena Declaration to join as international organizations that become one of co-signatories of this Jena Declaration (https://www.thejenadeclaration.org/supporters). We also translated this declaration into Indonesian language: https://www.thejenadeclaration.org/downloadtjd.

The Jena Declaration was proclaimed at the conference on "Humanities and Social Sciences for Sustainability" 21-22 October 2020, held in partnership with the Canadian and German Commissions for UNESCO, the International Council for Philosophy and Sciences, the Canadian Council for Social Sciences and Humanities Research, the Academy World Arts & Sciences, Club Rome, Academia Europaea and the International Geographical Union.

The Jena Declaration (TJD) establishes guidelines and practices to accelerate progress towards achieving the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In particular, the declaration aims to stimulate more culturally sensitive policies and programs that enhance, promote and facilitate the grassroots movements that are at the heart of the mobilization. With respect to cultural and regional diversity, the goal is to exceed the expectations of the United Nations' SDGs by 2030, and to set the table for greater success for each successive decade.



INVENTORY ORAL TRADITION

COLLECTING ORAL TRADITIONS FROM VARIOUS REGIONS IN INDONESIA

2021 is the second year of the Inventory Oral Tradition Program. Inventory of Indonesian Oral Tradition is a program that we created to collect and preserve oral tradition from various regions in Indonesia from Sabang to Merauke, that is, before this precious knowledge is forgotten. Oral tradition actually reflects the richness of intangible culture of Indonesia. For us, such tradition is precious for containing valuable cultural knowledge that is inherited generation after generation.

At this moment, we focus on collecting Indonesian Oral Tradition for the reason that Indonesia is known as a nation with multicultural places on Earth for it might provide more various and discrete traditions than any other places. After collecting it, we have a plan to do analysis by scientific approaches such as genetics, in order to determine the essential meanings and benefits of such tradition for communities, environment as well as for individuals. For this reason, in collecting such traditions we are focusing on the five rites of passage stories/traditions to be gathered from our respondents, consisting of the rite of birth, rite of adultery, rite of marriage, rite of ancestor-ship, and rite of death.

We believe, beyond the said tradition lies some valuable knowledge if we can analyze them by means of scientific research today. By apprehending the said tradition, we expect that it could become an enrichment of knowledge to various disciplines of science in patronizing sustainability in any aspect of life.

PRESERVING CULTURAL KNOWLEDGE

PRESERVING VARIOUS CULTURAL KNOWLEDGE

Based on the Law no. 5 of 2017 concerning the Advancement of Culture, one of the pillars of which is to take inventory and preserve, therefore, Chakra Cultural Foundation have opened a new program, namely "Preserving Cultural Knowledge." In the broadest sense, we preserve all cultural terms commonly used by indigenous peoples in any matters related to culture, ranging from food, drinks, rituals, goods, dances, musical instruments, proverbs, or other things are inventoried into hundreds of articles on our website. We hope that in the future this program will become a One Stop Cultural Dictionary. Technically, prior to uploading the article, we will also do a crosscheck first assisted by several academics from various universities in Indonesia. In this activity program, we collaborate with several lecturers in Indonesia, including from Padjadjaran University, Mr. Ira Indrawardana, S.Sos., M.Si and Mr. I Putu Gede Suyoga, ST., M.Sc. from the Bali Institute of Design and Business, Denpasar.

Currently this program is intended for all Indonesian people such as writers, cultural experts, cultural activists, indigenous peoples or people who really want to contribute their cultural knowledge to other communities. In the future it is possible to open this program for all people of the world. We do not focus on gathering cultural knowledge in any particular subject or field. JOURNAL PUBLISHING ACTIVITIES RESULTS FROM THE RESEARCH WE DO IN INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL PUBLISHERS

In May 2021, we were invited to contribute to an international conference, the 12th International Extramural Scientific and Practical Conference, held in Ukraine, chaired by Prof. Galyna Schevchenko. The conference is entitled "PROBLEMS OF SPIRITUAL AWAKENING OF A PERSONALITY: CULTURE AND SPIRITUAL VALUES." The conference was organized by the Ukrainian Ministry of Education and Science, National Academy of Pedagogical Sciences of Ukraine, Volodymyr Dahl East Ukrainian National University, Scientific Research Institute of Spiritual Development of Man, International UNESCO Chair "Spiritual and Cultural Values of Upbringing and Education," Pedagogy Department International Cultural Hub "The Age of Culture." The theme of this conference is (1) spiritual awakening as the key to spiritual security of personality and country, (2) spiritual foundation of personality culture, (3) art as a source of energy for personality spiritual awakening.

In this conference we succeeded in submitting research results in the form of a journal entitled "THE RITES OF PASSAGE: IMPREGNABLE BEHAVIOURAL EPIGENETICS IN STRENGTHENING PERSONAL HEALTHINESS, SPIRITUAL AND CULTURAL VALUES." This journal was published in October 2021 and is published in three languages, namely English, Russian and Ukrainian.

Journal publication as a result of the above conference is very important for us because for the first time the name of our Foundation has been entered into an organization or institute that can publish research journals.



The publication of this journal is very important to us because for the second time this year our Foundation has published a research journal.
